How long is the case likely to take?

This guide provides you with an approximation only and will vary depending upon the complexity of the particular case.

- a) Following a charge at the Police Station, a very short date for appearance in the Magistrates Court is given, normally within 3-7 working days.
- b) If you enter a guilty plea in the Magistrates Court the case can take up to between 3 and 12 weeks depending on whether a pre-sentence report is ordered.
- c) If you enter a not guilty plea in the Magistrates Court the case will normally be likely to take between 3 and 9 months.
- d) Where your case is committed to the Crown Court, the following time scales will apply:
 - i) To the stage of committal proceedings, at the Magistrates Court, approximately 2 to 4 months (depending upon the seriousness of the case).
 - ii) From the committal proceedings at the Magistrates Court to a trial at the Crown Court approximately 3 to 9 months.
 - iii) On a guilty plea at the Crown Court between 1 and 3 months.
